In 1936

the Sisters of St. Joseph of Peace purchased an ailing 60-bed community hospital for \$50,000. Over the past 70 years, the Sisters, physicians, nurses, community members, and dedicated employees have all worked to make Sacred Heart the largest regional medical center between Portland and San Francisco.

However, the area's growing population and the demographics of an aging baby boomer generation have put an increasing demand upon healthcare services in our community.

For more than three years, community leaders, physicians, nurses, and planners worked to develop a plan to meet the ever increasing needs of our community. The disruption to patient care over a 10 – 15 year construction period, the negative affects on neighboring businesses and homes, as well as the staggering half a billion dollar cost, made it clear that simply revitalizing the Hilyard campus was not an option. A new hospital was needed.

After a lengthy search throughout Eugene and Springfield, RiverBend emerged as the premier site for the creation of a state-of-the-art medical center that would allow for future expansion, easy access, and a healing environment along the banks of the majestic McKenzie River.

RiverBend is a bold step taken to ensure that Sacred Heart Medical Center continues to meet the growing healthcare needs of our region for generations to come.

As the backbone of this medical center, our dedicated employees are in a unique position to know that a hospital is much more than bricks and mortar. That is why the funds raised through this campaign will not be used for the construction of the hospital. Instead, it will be used to equip RiverBend with the very latest technology and medical equipment – technology that is so advanced that it may not even exist today.



What is "Miracles At Work?"

Miracles At Work – For Our Community, Our Health, Our Future is an employee driven campaign to help equip RiverBend with cutting edge, life saving, technology and medical equipment.

What is the goal of the Employee Campaign?

The primary goal of the employee campaign is to have 100% participation of the employees. Each gift is valued.

The Employee Leadership Committee has agreed upon a campaign goal of \$500,000 and hopes to surpass that amount.

Our enthusiastic participation in the employee campaign will play a critical role in influencing how the greater community views RiverBend.

What if I cannot complete my pledge, or I leave my job at PeaceHealth?

Pledges are voluntary. If you leave PeaceHealth, you will have the option of fulfilling, revising, or canceling your pledge.

How can I give to "Miracles At Work?"

Pledges are completely flexible and may be fulfilled over a period of time, up to five years. Pledge payments may be made by:

- Payroll deduction (\$2 minimum per pay period required)
- PTO Donations
- Cash, Visa, MasterCard

A giving guide is included with the campaign brochure to show you how easy it is to make a difference.

There are a number of ways to fulfill your pledge. The Foundation staff can work with you to best meet your needs.

When will payroll deductions begin?

Deductions will begin the first pay period in July.

How Do I Give?

How do I donate PTO?

You may donate any amount of PTO in one-hour increments provided that you have the PTO available to cover the donation at the time of your pledge. PTO donations will be made two times per year (July 31st and Oct 22nd)

PTO donations will require additional paperwork to satisfy IRS requirements. Foundation staff will contact you to complete this form once your pledge has been made.

Is my gift tax-deductible?

Cash, credit card, and payroll deduction gifts are fully tax deductible. PTO contributions are not deductible under IRS regulations.

What if I cannot complete my pledge, or I leave my job at PeaceHealth?

Pledges are voluntary. If you leave PeaceHealth, you will have the option of fulfilling, revising, or canceling your pledge.

Will my contribution be confidential?

YES! You will return your pledge card in a sealed envelope. Only the Foundation and Payroll will ever view that information. PTO donations will go directly to the Payroll office. Your hourly rate of pay will remain confidential. You also have the option of making a donation anonymously.
